4 Local children and families are invited to take part in a  
5 special community art exhibit celebrating our nation's 250th  
6 anniversary at the Broad Brook Community Center (BBCC) this  
7 summer.

8 The new art show, entitled "Past, Present, and Future,"  
9 will open at the BBCC on the Fourth of July at Guilford's annual  
10 "4th of July Picnic." The show organizers invite young artists to  
11 help bring this vision to life.

12 Children of all ages are encouraged to submit up to three  
13 pieces of individual artwork inspired by one of the three themes  
14 — past: What did Vermont look like back in 1776? present: What  
15 do you see and love about Vermont today? and future: What do  
16 you hope Guilford, Vermont, and the world will be like in 250  
17 years in 2276?

18 All forms of creativity are welcome, including painting,  
19 drawing, photography, collage, and mixed media. This is a  
20 chance for young people to celebrate their history, share their  
21 ideas, and be part of a meaningful community milestone.

22 Artwork can be dropped off at the BBCC on Guilford  
23 Center Road on the afternoon of June 13 or 27. In addition to  
24 individual submissions from young neighbors, community  
25 members of all ages are invited to participate in a collaborative  
26 community art project, which will go on display as part of the  
27 show.

28 During special sessions from 1 to 5 p.m. on June 13 and  
29 27, three large mixed-media banners will be created, one for the  
30 past, one for the present, and one for the future. Each participant  
31 will have the opportunity to collage their own creative piece to  
32 these shared works or add directly to the painted banners,  
33 helping to build a collective vision across generations.

34 At the banner-making sessions, there will also be  
35 supplies available for kids who'd like to create their art show  
36 entry during that time as well.

37 Adults and children who are interested in participating in  
38 the art show or banner making should email coordinator Ada  
39 Brown at [broadbrookcc@gmail.com](mailto:broadbrookcc@gmail.com) so organizers can plan for  
40 the correct amount of supplies.
